<p>Thursday 1:40pm - 2:40pm</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Keynote: Jon Bing - Liability for online expressions Session Chair: Anders Fagerjord room: RUNAN</p> <p>The Internet has become a vital medium for exchange of opinions, not just a mass-medium (one-to-many) but also between individuals (one-to-one or many-to-many). This exchange is governed by legal norms, and it can be difficult to understand how traditional law can be used in this new situation. Many different issues have been discussed, such as the use of photographs of individuals, online harassment, exchange of child pornography etc. In addition to this, the international aspects may not be fully understood. Many believe, for instance, that localising a server in another country means their own country's laws do not apply. At the same time the freedom of speech is challenged, as when Norwegian courts found opinions expressed in Swedish television (the same would apply to online forums) to be unacceptable. This talk will discuss decisions in Norway, Sweden and Denmark, for instance about Pirate Bay. Finally, the talk will be part of the ongoing research project on Internet Governance at the Norwegian Research Center for Computers and Law (NRCCL), University of Oslo.</p>
